

Children and Youth Religious Education

Dear UUCEP,

For the month of June the UU Youth will be exploring mystery. As children, life is such a mystery! That mystery drives our curiosity, our sense of adventure, and our thirst for knowledge. As a community that is committed to making this world a better place, what better place to start than with the youth. Through connecting with the youth, guiding them, teaching them and being in community with them, we help them unearth the mystery of humanity. As a child, my father told me that whenever I saw a hummingbird it meant that he was

thinking of me. Through that teaching- that gift of mystery- I found companionship, connectedness with nature and a loving curiosity of the mystery that is life. In that moment when a child's curiosity is allowed to explore- silently guided and unnoticably tended to, we plant seeds- visionary seeds of a hopeful future.

At times, those seeds seem to stall and we grow anxious for them to sprout, but we should reflect during those most potent times, when we, in our own child-like curiosity learned a deep lesson, a reflective light of truth, an answer to a piece of the mystery- when we experienced life's wonders. Speechless, without words, we learned the deepest lessons of life, not by some directive explanation or authoritive teaching, but rather, by living and learning. Take a moment to allow the mystery of life's forces overcome you, remember the child in you, and embrace the journey of life.

In exploring the mystery that life is, the UU Youth will participate in art activities that are intended to engage the unknown. Questions about life forces and circumstances will be the topic of our circle time conversations. We will discover our own spirit animals and learn how to create meaning and deepen our understanding of our own complexities. As we journey the maze-like path of mystery, we will seek comfort in unity, compassion in crisis, and solace in creation.
